# Product Reference Guide ClearGuard™ HD

Antimicrobial Barrier Caps

## Placing a ClearGuard HD Cap on a Haemodialysis Catheter



> Ensure that the catheter extension tubing pinch clamp is closed.



> Use the standard facility or industry recommended aseptic technique when accessing the catheter.



Use the standard facility and industry recommended practices to flush the catheter and to instill locking solution. Ensure that the catheter extension tubing pinch clamp is closed.



> Remove the pair of ClearGuard HD caps that are contained in a shield from the foil pouch.



> Remove a single ClearGuard HD cap (red or blue), by rotating the lock ring counterclockwise, taking care to only handle the lock ring; do not touch the rod.



- Carefully insert the ClearGuard HD rod into the catheter hub and, using a simultaneous push and twist motion, tighten by rotating clockwise.
- > Attach the remaining cap using the same procedure.

WARNING: Do not allow the ClearGuard HD rod or luer to contact non-sterile items; touching the rod or luer with non-sterile items may lead to a bloodstream infection. Discard the ClearGuard HD cap if the rod or luer contacts non-sterile items or gloved hands.

NOTE: As the ClearGuard HD rod enters the hub, it will displace some of the lock solution; this is desirable as it wets and distributes the chlorhexidine on the ClearGuard HD cap threads.


## Removing a ClearGuard HD Cap on a Haemodialysis Catheter



> Ensure that the catheter extension tubing pinch clamp is closed.



> Use the facility's standard cap and hub cleaning procedures.



- Carefully support catheter hub with one hand and, using other hand, remove ClearGuard HD cap by rotating counterclockwise and discard.
- After the cap is removed, proceed using your facility's current policies and procedures. Remove the remaining cap using the same procedure.

PRECAUTION: Caps must never be reused or reconnected to the catheter hub once removed or contamination of the catheter may occur.
